

Visa

Citizens of most European and some other countries may, without prior visa application, enter, transit or stay in the Republic of Serbia for up to 90 days, in a six-month period starting from the date of the first entry. Therefore, before travelling to Serbia, you should check whether you need a visa. For details, please visit the website of the [Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Serbia](#).

Registration upon arrival

All foreign citizens have to contact the Office for Foreigners at the Ministry of Interior in Užice (Police Department) within 24 hours upon the arrival and register their place of residence in Užice.
